TEYNHAM.

Teynham is an important industrial and agricultural parish situated three miles east of Sittingbourne and four-and-a-half west of Faversham. It possesses a station on the Southern Railway, and is about 43 miles from London. The parish is large, covering all the district between the London road and the River Swale, and also extending to the south side of the London Road, where it embraces Lewson Street. It is in the Faversham Parliamentary Division, the upper division of the Lathe of Scray, the Teynham Hundred, the Faversham Union, the Faversham Petty Sessional Division, and the Faversham County Court district. The area of the parish is 2,472 acres together with 279 acres of foreshore, and 115 of water and tidal water. The rateable value is £11,500, and the population at the last census (1921) was 1,734. The parish possesses one mile one furlong of main road, and seven miles, seven furlongs of district roads. Near the Swale are large brick-works engaged in the manufacture of the machine-made stock brick. The southern part of the parish is mainly devoted to agriculture, the principal crops being corn and hops with the produce of some famous orchards. Near the Swale is a large tract of land known as the Teynham Level. This is devoted solely to the raising of sheep and cattle. At one time these marshes were not properly drained, and malaria was prevalent in the parish; so much so that Teynham was notorious for being most unhealthy. Since the draining of the marshes, carried out under the direction of a Commission formed for the purpose (and who have powers to levy a scot) the village has become a desirable residential area. The principal landowners in the parish are Messrs. A. L. Mercer (Norton Court) and Mr. J. D. Maxted (Newlands). Lieut.-Colonel Charles John Roper Tyler is Lord of the Manor.

Historically Teynham is very ancient, and is mentioned as having been the town in which Archbishops resided in early times. Kenulf, King of Mercia, who reigned between the years 794 and 819, gave the place to Christ Church, Canterbury, and afterwards a palace was built in the village or town as it was known then. Archbishop Baldwin (1184-91), Hubert Walter (1193-1207), Langton (1207-29), and Raynold (1313-28) in turn lived at Teynham. Archbishop Stratford in 1345 entertained King Edward III. at Teynham, and King Henry III. granted the town the right to hold a market and fair. Richard Harrys, a fruiterer to Henry VIII., lived at Teynham, and he planted 105 acres of land with cherries and apples that he had obtained from abroad, and thus the village is probably the earliest in which the cherry was grown in Kent.

The Parish Church, dedicated to St. Mary, is built in the form of a cross, and is of flint in the Early English and Perpendicular styles. The tower contains six bells. There are several handsome stained glass windows. There are also a number of brasses in fair condition in the Church. In 1873 the spacious chancel was restored. The registers date from the year 1538, and the sittings in the Church number 300. The living is a Vicarage of the net yearly value of £250, with residence, and is in the gift of the Archdeacon of Canterbury. It has been held since 1924 by the Rev. Laurence Bevil Charles Newell, M.A., Dunelm, Hon. C.F. The parish is in the Rural Deanery of Ospringe and the Archdeaconry and Diocese of Canterbury.

The Guardian for the parish is Mr. H. T. Bensted, and the Overseers are Messrs. P. French and Bridges R. Dixon.

Parish Council: The Parish Council meets four times a year, or as often as necessary. The Council is composed as follows: Messrs. P. French (chairman), J. S. Read, A. Ashdown, F. Austen, W. Eason, A. G. Andrews, F. Datson, G. Mills, and the Rev. L. C. B. Newell. The position of Clerk is at present vacant.

There are several small charities existing in the parish. Lake's Charity brings in a sum of about £10 per annum, which is devoted to providing coal and clothing to necessitous persons. Other charities bring in about £4 per annum, which is generally distributed in kind.

Births and Deaths Registry: Mr. S. George is registrar of births and deaths for the Teynham sub-district, which comprises the parishes of Teynham, Lynsted, Norton, Newnham, Doddington, Eastling, Stalisfield, Buckland, Stone, and Luddenham.

Income Tax: Mr. F. R. Court is collector of King's taxes for the Teynham district (Teynham, Lynsted, and Norton).

St. Andrew's Church: This church at Greenstreet was built as a Men's Institute, but eventually became a chapel of ease to the Parish Church. **Churchwardens:** Dr. P. G. Selby and Mr. Carter. **Chorister:** Mr. A. G. D. West. **Organist:** Mrs. Carter. **Services on Sunday evenings at 6.30.** Holy Communion, 3rd and 5th Sundays, at eight a.m., and on Saints' days, at 7.30 a.m.

Wesleyan Church: This place of worship was built in 1841 and enlarged in 1860. It holds about 500 persons. **Services** are held on Sundays, 10.45 and 6 o'clock. The pulpit is filled by the resident Wesleyan Ministers in the Faversham Circuit, and by local preachers. **Superintendent Minister:** Rev. Wesley Hughes, Newton Road, Faversham. **Chorister:** Mr. F. Carrier. **Sunday School, 10 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.** The Sunday School is situated in Lynsted Lane, Lynsted. **Superintendent:** Mr. F. Carrier. **Wesley Guild, Thursdays, 7.30 p.m.** **Secretary:** Mr. H. Watts. **Class Meetings** are led by Mrs. Millen, and Mrs. Hooker (Senior and Junior). The Church officials are: **Society Stewards:** Messrs. H. J. Watts and J. Harvey. **Poor Stewards:** Messrs. R. Carrier and Miss Hales. **Chapel Steward:** Mr. H. J. Watts.

United Methodist Church: This Church is situated in Teynham Street. **Services** are held on Sundays at 6 p.m. and every alternate Wednesday at 7 p.m. during the winter months. **Sunday School 3 p.m.** The pulpit is filled by the resident minister at Faversham, and by local preachers. **Steward:** Mr. F. Edwards, Conyer.

Salvation Army—see Lynsted.

Conyer Mission Church: This iron building is opened on Sundays at 10 a.m. for the purposes of Sunday School, and other parochial gatherings. **Superintendent of Sunday School:** the Rev. L. B. C. Newell (Vicar).

Teynham Parochial Schools, Barrow Green: These Schools were erected in 1849, and have been enlarged from time to time (1872, 1884, and 1905). The buildings provide accommodation for about 375 children, and there are about 370 children on the books, including 100 infants. The staff is as follows:—Mr. George Potts (headmaster), Mrs. Potts (headmistress, girls' department), Mrs. M. Thomas (headmistress, infants' department), Mr. A. Gates, Mrs. Gates, Miss Clark, Miss Long, and Miss Ray. The Board of School Managers meets once in six weeks, and is composed as follows:—Rev. L. B. C. Newell (chairman and correspondent), Mr. J. D. Y.M.C.A. Hut: This hut, situated in Station Road, Teynham, was established in 1920 for the purpose of being used as a social club and as a place where parochial gatherings of various kinds might be held.
